This Month, Town Hall, No Business Meeting

Serena: Site fees have been \$400~500 for site fees. It's going to be higher, so fund raising needs to be expanded. Outside of events it would be nice to do some fund raisers as well.

We hoped to foster a climate of respect within the Barony, and have been rewarded by an overall sense of community. Our people have been able to speak freely to each other and to their leadership. The Seadogs e-list has been made public, underscoring the commitment of this Barony to be open and convivial to all who enter our lands. We pledged to work with Our Chatelaine to help recruit new members. While We cannot take credit for the recent growth within Our Barony, We happily welcome our newest members (and those returning from sojourn) and all are inspired by your energy and enthusiasm. We have watched Lady Serena ably manage Our coffers and been honored to host several activities at Our home. It seems that We have meet Our initial goals and We were at a loss as to what direction to follow next. Fortunately, We had the privilege to meet with several of you at the last "Town Hall" meeting, and heard your suggestions with open ears and willing hearts. To that end, We, Erwin and Mary Isabel do pledge to bend Our will and service to the following goals:

- 1) We will continue to aid and support fundraising efforts within this Barony. We are regularly attracting larger numbers to our events and may need to look for larger sites. The plus side is that larger numbers mean greater profits for the Barony. The down side is that larger sites require larger deposits. Also, We need to look at replacing items as they become worn or are used. The kitchen tent will someday need replacing. Award medallions will need to be purchased. Wouldn't it be nice to have a dayshade for the Barony to sit under during events? All of these goals have price tags attached, so let's get Our creative thinkers working on fundraising ideas. Unfortunately, the Baronial Shower Guild suggestion (from Barony Erwin) was already shot down; while it does not lack for willing customers, it does lack for good taste. Baron Erwin and I have pledged to buy the first round of drinks after the Barony breaks \$5000 free and clear (not earmarked for an event, etc.) Please help make that happen for us and the Barony.
- We will encourage and support renewing the monthly Newcomer Meetings. During the "Town Hall" meeting, it was mentioned that folks found the previous Newcomer Meetings useful. We are searching for an individual to spearhead this effort. Note: This does not mean teaching all of the classes, it entails arranging teachers and scheduling the classes. We are able to get a room at the Southern Maryland Higher Education Center on Tuesdays, so we have a public meeting space for interested folks to learn more about us. We will also need teachers. If you've been playing a year or more, you probably have information that would benefit a new person. Classes can range from teaching the heraldic colors, making your set up look more "period" for events or even how to get started making garb. The classes do not need to be complicated (and probably will work better if they aren't). Let's make sure that when someone shows an interest in the SCA, we give them a good chance to find their niche.
- We will continue to host and support social activities for Dun Carraig and their friends. This will include caravanning to events, Baronial "sweat shops", weekly lunches and demos. (Erwin and I are still negotiating the "Baronial Sleep-over" suggestion, smile). We support the efforts of Our people to form sub-groups and guilds to explore their own personal interests within the SCA. We ask only that these groups bring the fruits of their efforts back to the Barony, so that all may benefit. Sponsor workshops to make silk banners, or wrap saris, teach classes, travel to events, oh I know!...make largess (you can't think We'd let a golden opportunity to ask for largess go by!).

The last year has had amazing growth and renewal for Dun Carraig. These changes are the result of hard work, done by Our people. We have had many changes in Officers and are gratified to see many of Our populace staying on as Officers, but striving to learn a new position. We have many people join Our Barony, striving to learn a new hobby. A Barony is made great by the efforts of it's people. Thank you for allowing Us to stand in the presence of greatness.

Chronicler's Note: This is one of my new monthly additions to our newsletter. Each month I'll ask someone to give the story of how he/she became involved in the SCA, and/or Dun Carraig. As an introduction, I'll start with myself.

My first glimpse of the SCA was in Jacksonville, FL, where I attended JU. Asmall (and I mean very small) Renaissance Fair was put on, and a friend and I went to go check it out. I was so enthused, I asked around about participating the following day, and was directed to the gentle playing the part of Queen Elizabeth I. We arranged to meet at her house the next morning, where she handed me some loaner garb. Throughout the day other participants gave me information about the SCA. It was a great "first event." Due to class schedule, and social life, I never pursued it at that point.

Fast-forward about 5 years, and I was living back in Maryland, working for the same park system I currently do, but at the Visitor Center to Patuxent River Park. One Sunday morning the schedule said there was a group labeled 'SCA' at one of the camp sites. Since it was my duty to patrol the park throughout the day, I decided to go see if this was the same SCA I'd found back in Florida.

Sure enough, it was, (turns out it was Storvik's Novice Tourney, and, oddly enough, Gormr's first event). So again, I asked around about the group and determined to look more into getting involved this time.

I went to a few garb workshops, some in Storvik, some in Dun Carraig. Storvik's Post Pennsic Revel was my first official event, and Birthday was my first Dun Carraig event. Since then, I became more heavily involved with Lochmere, joining their singing group, and Laydies Fayre. Now that I'm more firmly ensconced in Dun Carraig (oh yeah, and married too), I consider this my home Barony (no, don't go bragging to Lochmere about that too much, please...ha-ha).

As I go forward I want to try to become more involved in illumination arts, maybe concentrating on pigment used for paint and ink, and researching patterns to use for personas that might not have had illumination works done in their time and place.
