Baronial Letters of Intent



Unto the wonderful populace of Dun Carraig does his Grace, Duke Ragnarr Blackhammer send greetings this fine April morning. A few months ago at the business meeting when Mistress Ceridwen jokingly put my name forth it verbalized a thought that had started to grow inside my head. After going to Gulf Wars and having the honor of wearing His Excellency Cathal's tabard and carry his weapons that little voice became a veritable shout. All that remained was convincing the noblest lady I know to do the job with me. It is my incredible honor to announce that Lady Lynette Semere, the Lady of my household, has consented to run with me on the polling that will choose the next Baron and Baroness of this fine Barony.

For many years my concerns have been those of the Kingdom as a whole with the day to day function of the Barony I lived in whichever one it happened to be at the time taking a back seat. This doesn't mean I was unwilling to help out in my local area; it was just the secondary focus of my attentions in the Society. As I get a little older, and I hope wiser, I feel that it is time to change that focus. There are so many good and worthy gentles in this barony that do such a diverse number of activities. The primary job I feel that I as a Baron would have is recognizing those efforts and making sure that those efforts are brought to the attention of the Crown. My ability to hold court and give out recognition has been shown during three reigns as King of Atlantia. While the jobs are similar I know there are some important differences. I think these differences would provide some fun and challenge to the position.

The secondary but in some ways more important job of the Baron and Baroness is to support the various activities taking place in the Barony and more specifically the people doing those activities. This takes a level of work and in some instances an ability to teach and help. I have been recognized as a Knight for my armored fighting ability and a Provost for my skill with a rapier. I have also been recognized with a Sea Stag for teaching of the martial arts and a Golden Dolphin for my service to the Kingdom. I have taken a little time off to relax and enjoy the good life around my Duchy but I think it is time for me to get my "hands dirty" again so that I may still be worthy of those awards. I know that Sir Theron is trying again to get the fighters of Dun Carraig to work and train together and that Baron Chris and Mistress Ceridwen could always use another hand, and blade, in helping the fencers in the Barony.

I have only lived in Dun Carraig for about a year and a half but I am very familiar with the group. As King I did 2 of the last 3 polling for the Barony so I have a wealth of knowledge on the past history and politics of the group. I have also seen the group change a great deal in the past few years. Between a number of peers moving in (myself, Mistress Ceridwen, Sir Harold) as well as a number of homegrown peerage elevations (Mistress Mathilde, Mistress Molly, Master Geoffrey, and Sir Theron) the number of peers and leaders in the group has exploded in the past few years. These new peers have lent their strength to the Barony alongside Dun Carraig's group of hard working long standing peers. There are also long time leaders like Baron Khadir and Her Excellency Lore complimented by new leadership from the likes of Baron Chris and Lady Ysane. With the recent losses of His Excellency Cathal and of Mistress Kiri, the very heart of the Barony, the group will need the help and leadership more than ever. I feel that I have a good working relationship with the peers and leaders of Dun Carraig and will be able to both support and help them with their efforts.

I have made a case for my acceptability to be the next Baron of Dun Carraig but I truly feel I am the less desirable of the baronial pairing. If the populace of the Barony is willing to accept me as their Baron they would get to have Lady Lynette Semere as their next Baroness. What a lucky Barony.

Lady Lynette has spent her entire time in the Society in the Barony of Dun Carraig. She has a passion and love for her home barony that I would do my best to match. Lady Lynette is an incredibly hard worker. She is an accomplished autocrat and received the Award of the Herring for running the Baronial Birthday and Investiture of Cathal and Lore. She also did Novice/Challenge and the following Challenge of the Heart, and was the co-autocrat of the 12th Night held in Dun Carraig. Lynette has served as a retainer for two former Baronesses of Dun Carraig and a former Queen of Atlantia, Baroness Amalia, Baroness Molly, and Countess Kalisa. Lady Lynette has also done extensive work supporting the fighters of Atlantia as a water bearer, including donating items for an auction to raise funds for water bearing supplies. She has received both the Award of the Fountain and a King's Award of Excellency specifically for her water bearing service. She also received the Order of the Opal for all of her service to Dun Carraig and Atlantia.

Lady Lynette is a very talented artisan and supporter of the arts and sciences. She is an accomplished seamstress, making historic garb from many different time periods. Lynette received the Order of the Coral Branch for her costuming. She has made and gifted garb to many members of the Barony. Lady Lynette also does pewter casting and works in metal wire. She has made tokens for the events she autocrated, created chains for Knights in the Barony, and wire wrapped a number of sharks' teeth to donate to the Crown. Lynette has given sewing and patterning lessons to other members of the Barony as well as teaching pewter casting and chain mail making.

I believe that Lady Lynette and I would make a good choice as the next Baron and Baroness of Dun Carraig. I feel we having many areas of strength that overlap as well as many that are complimentary. My biggest strengths I see are in the areas of SCA knowledge, experience, and presence. Lynette is the total package. She is a lady of beauty, grace, and kindness in the body of an incredibly hard worker who is willing to move tables, carry chairs, set stakes, and generally get her hands dirty if necessary. With the recent changes in her life (pregnant) Lynette will be staying close to Dun Carraig for the most part. I on the other hand will have no problem traveling through the Kingdom to promote Dun Carraig and her people. Lady Lynette and I are putting our names in with the full support of her wonderful husband Lord Erik of Dun Carraig. He hopes to get more active on a local level but not to the level of wanting to try to be Baron. He would also be graciously taking on the task of helping with their children if Lady Lynette is called upon to be the next Baroness of Dun Carraig.

Greetings to Their Majesties, Their Highnesses, Her Excellency Baroness Lore, the Populace of Dun Carraig, and all who hear this missive,

This letter is to inform you that we, Lord Matthew of Summerdale and Lady Adriana Michaels, wish to be considered for Baron and Baroness of the Barony of Dun Carraig. This letter of intent describes our backgrounds and experience in the SCA and the qualifications we would bring to the position if selected.

We both started in the SCA in college, Adriana in 2000, and Matthew in 2001. We were in the same college group (a school club rather than an official SCA college), which was located in the Shire of Hartshorn-dale in the East Kingdom. We held various offices in the college group. Adriana served as treasurer/exchequer, and Matthew served as

president/seneschal. The college group held a yearly revel that we invited the local shire to. We also provided meeting space for the shire business meeting and participated in those.

Adriana's first Pennsic was Pennsic 30, and Matthew's was 31. Adriana spent most of her first Pennsic waterbearing on the field, as well as taking classes and watching fighting. For his first Pennsic, Matthew was only there for the first week, so he took a number of classes and helped the group get the camp set up and ready for the next week.

After Adriana graduated from college, she moved to northwest Pennsylvania and taught middle school English. She continued to be active in the SCA, playing with the then-incipient Shire of Blackwater in Aethelmearc. She attended practices regularly and authorized in weapon & shield. For the sixth grade's Middle Ages week, she arranged a demo with members of the local SCA group. This included demonstrations of fighting and giving students the chance to try on chain mail. Students and teachers alike greatly enjoyed this demo.

Once Matthew graduated in 2005, we both moved to Southern Maryland, where Matthew had grown up. One of the first things we did was look up the local SCA group and start attending meetings and A&S nights in Dun Carraig.

Early in 2005, Adriana became the deputy chronicler, helping put out the Clyffe Notes. In December, Adriana took over as chronicler and held that position for two years. In A.S. 41, the Clyffe Notes was nominated for a Blackfox Award for best overall newsletter. Adriana established the "Overheard in Dun Carraig" feature, a monthly compilation of funny quotes heard around the barony. After stepping down as chronicler, she continued providing quotes for this feature, and it was nominated for a Blackfox Award for best regular feature in A.S. 43. Adriana also autocratted Baronial Birthday in 2007, a fun and well-attended event. Additionally, Adriana is a warranted heavy marshal and MOL, and has served as Dun Carraig's MOL since 2007.

In April 2006, Matthew became deputy exchequer for Dun Carraig. As deputy, Matthew worked to learn the duties of the exchequer and supported the exchequer. As part of this position, Matthew was also the emergency deputy exchequer, which included being available to take over for the exchequer if needed and keeping in communication with the exchequer to make sure he was aware of the current state of the office and any issues or concerns.

In September 2006, Matthew took over as webminister for Dun Carraig. One of the major changes he made was a massive overhaul of the webpage, both front and backend. He changed the webpage code to make it easier to maintain and incorporated Cascading Style Sheets (CSS) to allow for easy and consistent implementation of styles and formatting across the website. The website content was updated and other changes were made based upon barony members' complaints, comments and feedback about the website. He set up a members' section, which included an electronic baronial inventory system, so that members could see what items the barony had, and the quartermaster could track where the items were. When the new webminister's handbook was published, Matthew made sure that the website was compliant with the guidelines it contained.

In February 2010, Matthew stepped up as Exchequer for the Barony. As part of his duties, Matthew was responsible for scheduling Financial Committee meetings, which primarily were held to work out and approve event budgets. Matthew also worked with event reservationists and troll to make sure that staff were trained and procedures followed. Matthew was also responsible for keeping track of baronial finances and making sure reports were submitted on time, and that baronial and kingdom policies were followed. Because groups can be suspended for failing to follow policy, Matthew's attention to rules and regulations has been very important to the barony. In late 2010, the Maryland groups were moved into the SCA-MD subsidiary, which required a change to the baronial bank account. Matthew was responsible for making this change over, including opening the new account, closing the old one, and maintaining reports for both accounts.

Matthew and Adriana have a wide range of interests and experiences in SCA activities. We are both authorized siege engineers, and have operated our own ballista at Pennsic in support of Atlantia's army (for which we were inducted into the King's Missiliers). Matthew is a warranted siege marshal. Adriana and Matthew are both authorized heavy fighters and have fought at Pennsic and other events. Matthew is also authorized in Combat Archery. Adriana is an authorized rapier fighter.

Matthew and Adriana have both participated in cooking for events, helping with feast prep and day-of cooking, and Matthew served as head cook for Baronial Birthday, researching and cooking a Viking feast. Adriana is a member of the choir group Ladies Faire, who often perform at local events. Adriana has done calligraphy for scrolls, with Matthew doing illumination. Adriana does fingerloop braiding and knitting and has taught classes on these arts, teaching both children and adults. Adriana and Matthew have participated in numerous other A&S activities as well.

This wide range of interests is useful to the role of baronage because the baronage are responsible for recognizing the talent and hard work of barony members in all activities. Familiarity with a variety of activities would help us in giving awards, in supporting all the officers in the barony, and in encouraging barony members in their various activities.

Adriana and Matthew have demonstrated responsibility, as shown by the positions we have successfully executed. We have also been active long enough and broad enough to generally know everyone in the barony, plus others in neighboring baronies. We work well together and complement each other, having a wide coverage of interests and abilities between the two of us. We have been very active in the barony, attending just about every baronial event and meeting, as well as most practices and A&S activities.

If we are selected as Baron and Baroness, we have a few main goals. We see the main role of the baronage as to support and encourage activities within the barony--whether that's local practices and classes or barony members branching out to do more at a regional and kingdom level. This includes attending everything we can, providing hospitality at events, arranging carpools, and generally encouraging barony members however we can.

We plan to encourage and support the continuation of the monthly A&S classes. These have been very successful, and we want to help that continue. We also want to support all the regular baronial activities. The barony's heavy practice is picking up momentum now as people are gearing up for Pennsic; we'd like to keep some of that excitement and enthusiasm going even after the war.

We will also host baronial get-togethers every month or so, both general "bring a project and hang out" days and "sweatshops" to work on things like loaner gear maintenance, donations for gift baskets, and things to improve the barony's Pennsic encampment (such as new silk banners and finishing painting the sheet wall). Our general plan would be to alternate between the two, so that people have ample opportunities to work on their own projects and to support larger efforts.

We hope to have a baronial presence at lots of events, including bring snacks and the dayshade to provide a place for socializing.

We think it's really important to field a strong baronial unit. On the armored side, Matthew fights CA and spear and Adriana fights polearm, forms that are well suited to commanding a unit. Because we're less experienced in combat and command than a number of people in the barony, we'd be soliciting a lot of advice from them. We also would like to have a baronial unit for rapier war points, since the barony has a number of rapier fighters, but the focus unit-wise has been largely on armored.

One major project we want to work on is making additional baronial tabards. (This will include making sure they don't turn pink when washed!) We would also like to establish something similar for rapier to identify our rapier fighters as a unit--possibly capelets with baronial heraldry. Dun Carraig has gorgeous heraldry that's highly recognizable on the field, and we want to use that to the barony's--and the kingdom's--full advantage.

If we have the great honor of being selected as Dun Carraig's baronage, we will work very hard to fulfill the duties of the position and the trust placed in us by both the Royalty and the populace of Dun Carraig. We hope that this missive has shown who we are and what we would do if selected, but we know that, despite its length, it can't possibly answer all questions. While serving as Baronage previously, Erwin & I were able to see Dun Carraig increase its budget a thousand-fold, and got to share in the new challenges and opportunities created by actually HAVING money.

We also seek (selected for Baronage or not) to further increase the Barony through the recruitment of new members. We look to continue to develop excitement in the local colleges, and to develop possible new sites for event use at St. Mary's College of Maryland. We would also seek to promote the SCA publically by leading some "Practice in the Park" activities this summer. It is our hope that increased visibility of the Barony will spark local interest and allow us to share our hobby with others.

We are in the unique position of completely understanding the demands and expectations that the role of Baron & Baroness entails. We have fought, hoped and loved this Barony with each of you in turn and seek the opportunity to do so again.


